But a good end result has been achieved; we have not been 100% successful in everything we've done, but for our first season it has been good. We have been able to put a substantial amount of money into the development of Hockey in Derbyshire. Thanks particularly to Laura, Anne and Nick and to Derbyshire Sport (Dan, Andrea and David{Joy}) for their help this season. We really could do with more (particularly administrative) assistance though going forward. Accounts (relating to previous full season ended August 2008)– we've spent far more than we've taken in – due to our spending accumulated grant money from this and previous years. Most expenditure has been on coaching but we will have to find ways of funding equipment for the future – sticks, balls, training kits etc. Please ensure that monies are paid over to Ann and that invoices are passed on to Ann for payment rather than being paid out of match fees etc. (things are much improved this year).	<b>Action: All</b>

## Reports from Officers:

### President's report (Peter Danson)

As usual, a lot has happened in the last 12 months affecting Derbyshire Hockey and I will summarise the main points.

#### Secretary

No one came forward to fill the role of Secretary so, as well as President, I have been Acting Secretary for the last year and Nick Roberts has thankfully done all the minutes of the DHA Committee meetings.

#### Hockey Development Officer

We have been without an HDO for most of the year, but Jamie Fleet was appointed in March 2009 and he has already made a big impact.

#### Governing Bodies Officer for Derbyshire Sport

The DHA committee have had several meetings with David Joy, Dan Newton and Andrea Stone from Derbyshire Sport, mainly to do with how best to use the under-spend of £44000 of Active Sports Grant for the development of Junior Hockey.

#### Website

Nick Roberts continues to look after the Derbyshire Hockey Association website [www.derbyshire-hockey.org.uk](http://www.derbyshire-hockey.org.uk) and contributions in electronic form are welcome. Please use the website. There is lots of hockey stuff on there, including much on Junior hockey.

#### Venues for Meetings

All the DHA Committee meetings and DHDG meetings have continued to be held at the Wirksworth Leisure Centre which seems fairly convenient for most people.

#### Courses

There are two Level 1 Player Coaching Courses in our area, one at Derby College, Mackworth and one at Highfields, Nottingham, both in May/June 09 and one Level 2 Course in July at Derby College. Hopefully, more players from Derbyshire clubs will attend these courses than last year.

A Foundation Umpires' Course has taken place in Derbyshire, organised by Ann Bradley.

#### Derbyshire Hockey Development Group

There have been four meetings this year and the main items have been the Funding Bids for the £44000 and the Single System. Clubs, coaches, umpires and volunteers are welcome to attend these meetings and to give their opinions on all sorts of issues.

#### Community Sports Coaching

Managed by myself on behalf of DHA for three and a half years, using ring-fenced money through Derbyshire Sport, this successful project has now been incorporated into the regions' junior hockey development programmes with the new funding bids.

Most of the coaching was with primary school children. In total, 10000 different children did hockey in curriculum time and about 1000 of those have gone on to attend weekly after-school clubs or evening clubs on Astroturf, connected with a hockey club. Twenty

coaches were used altogether, though the bulk of the delivery was done by four level 2 coaches who were available during the daytime.

## Bids for Funding for Regions for Junior Hockey Development

There have been lots of meetings and discussions since October, about how to use the £44000 under-spend and eventually it was agreed to spend the money in regions through the school partnerships and clubs. Further funding has been obtained through the regions from Sports Unlimited and School Sport Coaching grants. The community sports coaching will therefore continue to take place in the regions. Most of this new development will take place next season and hopefully more funding will be obtained, through the regions, for future years.

## Single System for Hockey (LTAD)

This season, we have successfully completed a dry-run, using three Development Centres (north, central and south) which have fed into one Academy Centre. The Single System is the development pathway for players (U13 to U17), coaches and officials and is being funded through England Hockey.

Anne Wilkinson, Laura Loeber, Sally Cozens, Judy Hooker and all the coaches have done a marvellous job in getting this project off the ground and much more information will be given under item 10 on the agenda.

## Other National Funding

UK Sport have awarded £14.1 million (25% increase) over 4 years to EH and GBH for elite hockey activities (international matches, Olympic Games etc) and Sport England have awarded £11.5 million (an increase) over 4 years to EH for grassroots hockey (I hope we see some of this).

## Quicksticks

Courses have now been arranged for teachers so that children will soon be able to play Quicksticks in some Derbyshire primary schools. This is in addition to the community sports coaching.

## Long Pile Pitches (3G)

These are unsuitable for most hockey. England Hockey are doing their own tests, independent of FIH, and will come up with some recommendations soon.

## Red Cards

Only a few Red Cards this year. More detail in Nick's report.

## New Experimental Rules

The main one is that a self-pass has been introduced from 1 May 09. It means, from a free-hit, touch, 16 yard hit or long corner, you can pass to yourself. It does speed up the game; I know, having played it recently with the England Over 65s.

## Hockey in Derbyshire

In Derbyshire, there are 11 Men's clubs making up 40 teams and 13 Women's clubs making up 25 teams. That means over 715 playing hockey every week and that, of course, doesn't take into account all the junior players we have.

## Future of Derbyshire Hockey

I stated this in my first report two years ago and it is still true today.

'The critical path for the future development of hockey in Derbyshire will depend ultimately on the number and quality of COVs (Coaches, Officials and Volunteers) in clubs and schools. We get funding through Derbyshire Sport (plus lots of help and advice), we rely a lot on the RDM and HDO, and PDMs, SDOs, CSDOs, SSCOs and PLTs can and are doing great work as facilitators, but without COVs there will be no development. We have a lot of COVs but we need more. There are still some Derbyshire Clubs not doing Junior Hockey.'

## Treasurer's Report AGM May 09

The past 12 months have been very busy behind the scenes. A small number of people have worked very hard to get us to the point where the financing of the single system and the Development Grants is now in place. It has been a long, hard struggle with much negotiation and time investment to get to this stage, but gradually we have brought more people on board with the new ways of working and things are running reasonably smoothly. The first year set up is not perfect but we hope to improve on this in the coming year with tighter procedures and starting the planning at an earlier date.

The grants have been allocated to the area groups and the first half has been paid to those who have invoiced me as requested. Involving more partners in the groupings has led to more matched funding being made available, more focussed planning and hopefully more targeted coaching with clearly defined player pathways. With more funding opportunities available from the involvement of all partners the future looks bright.

I would like to thank Laura, Anne and Nick for all their support this year, without which I wouldn't have got through the year. Nor should we forget the support we have had from Dan, Andrea and David at Derbyshire Sport. The main issue to come out of this past year is that we must have more people taking on the roles available in the committees, as we need more people to manage the admin and the processes involved. Those on whom the tasks have fallen in the past year have spent long hours working for the DHA and the development of hockey and we desperately need others on board to share the load and widen horizons.

The accounts tonight are those from the 2007.08 season. The accounts for the current year close at the end of August. The accounts are as they have been presented to the auditor, but they have not yet been approved. As you can see Expenditure far outweighs income. This is due in the most part to the spending of grant monies from the previous year. As our development programme gains pace, hopefully the income and the expenditure will coincide more closely. Other income and expenditure is much the same as other years. The balance in the DHA accounts at the end of August 08 was £25,111.90.

Reminder to hand in all monies received to me and to ensure invoices are sent to me for payment instead of handing me balances.

Thanks to all those who have paid monies to me promptly.

## Single System (Laura Loeber)

Progress has been made with the implementing of the Single System within Derbyshire for both girls and boys sections.

Junior Development Centres have been run for girls and boys at the age groups U13, U15 and U17 at Foremark and Wirksworth on two full days each and the boys had a competition day all together. Unfortunately the last girls competition day was cancelled due to

bad weather. The sessions were also run once at Tupton but the uptake was very poor so it was with regret that we had to discontinue with these. Hopefully, with further development in the North of the county we plan to try these again, most likely at St Mary's School, Chesterfield where support has been pledged from Chesterfield and Staveley HC. Numbers at both Burton and Wirksworth were very good apart from when sessions clashed with the boys County programme.

We feel that great strides have been made with the boys section which we have piloted this year even though we had not received funding for this. However it has been very challenging as the boys have been still involved with the old County calendar which has not fitted into the new calendar very well. This should be resolved next year when England Hockey releases the centralised calendar. Our new challenge will be to find increased resources in terms of pitch and coach provision as girls and boy's dates will coincide.

We are indebted to Tony Collier who has lead the sessions at Foremark and Helen Greer who has lead the sessions at Wirksworth, and Dawn Moore who lead at Tupton. More coaches are desperately needed, particularly Level two and above. Helen and Tony have been especially well supported by assistant coaches and volunteers from Matlock Baileans and Burton HC.

Post Christmas we moved into the Junior Academy/ County programmes.

## **Girls U13** - Helena Honarmond, Sarah Abel, Annie Lord

Had a very large squad from the JDCs. Selection made more difficult by the fact the last Competition day between the JDCs was cancelled due to bad weather but Helena set up training days to organise the girls into teams. We have plans to improve the move from JDC to JAC next year at this age group.

Ran both A and B squads. Played 18 Won 11, Drew 4, Lost 3. Midlands Tournament Winners

## **Girls U14**

Faye Wilkinson and Paul

Problems at this age group were a shortage of players within the County, making a very small squad. Also had over half the squad unavailable for most of the matches as the dates clashed with U15 Club games and National Schools U16 finals. This should be resolved with EH issuing Priority Calendar for next season. 6 players invited to JRPC assessments.

## **Girls U15**

Liz English, Gaye Smedley, Sally Spencer

A large squad of 26 from the JDCs. Played 7 won 5 drew 1 abandoned 1. Midlands Tournaments Winners. National Tournament Finished 4<sup>th</sup>. 12 Players invited to JRPCs

## **Girls U17**

Helen Greer, Katy Honeyman, Nic Martin

Played 18 Won 13 Lost 1 Drew 1

Outstanding success at this age group. There was an increased opportunity for a wider group of girls to play in the fixtures before they were joined by the England girls for the Tournaments, where their expert skills and contributions ensured victory at both the Regional and National Levels.

As we understand the Single System this is the last time that those who have played at a higher level will return to play at this level of competition.

We are indebted to the Managers and Coaches who have volunteered their time and energy into ensuring the continued success of the County at Schoolgirl level. Although some funding was available to us, this really only supported the new developments and what in effect, was the 'Old County' system, was delivered on a voluntary basis. We were fortunate to be able to use several parents who have umpiring qualifications as well as Anne Bradley, Christine Poyser, Pete Twiname and Chris Gough who all generously gave of their time.

## **County Boys' Report 2008/09**

We must begin our report with a big thank you to the ladies, lead by Laura Loeber, who have helped Judy and I enormously this year as we ventured into the world of Boys county Hockey. Without their help I think we would have fallen at the first hurdle.

The season began with a sudden and rather shocking realisation that by 19<sup>th</sup> Oct we needed an U14 and U16 boys county team David Ross, Tony Collier and Tom Williams stepped forward as coaches and with referrals from the newly established JDCs we had our first JAC/ selection trial for both age groups at the end of September.

We had two further training sessions and competed successfully in the tournaments held on two dates in October and November U14s came 5<sup>th</sup> and the U16s came 2<sup>nd</sup> - we felt this was a very good start and were very determined to continue knowing that now we needed an U15 and U17 team.

This competition is spread over three dates and the winners at each age group go through to a National final.

Following successful JACs with well over 50 boys invited over the two age groups we again established two teams. Chris Clayton , from Buxton, joined us as a second U17 coach.

Sadly we didn't get beyond the Regional stages despite two very strong teams

U15s came 3<sup>rd</sup> and U17s came 7<sup>th</sup>.

They played some fantastic hockey and it was a great opportunity for them all.

Very encouraging that there is such a wealth of talented players within the County.

Sadly Derbyshire did not enter the U18 Boys competition as there was nobody able to select and run the team

The U19 competition was amalgamated with the U21s this year and again there was no team from Derbyshire

The Regional Indoor competition was held in December

Only Belper entered at U16 level from Derbyshire and sadly were knocked out by Beeston in the semi-finals

U18 –Repton and Belper entered. This was won by Repton but they were sadly beaten by Ipswich in the semi-finals of the Nationals.

In the National Schools competition there was a big disappointment for many players as Ecclesbourne school failed to enter at any age group. This would have been a very good opportunity for some players who don't make a club team to play hockey at a higher level

Trent and Repton did well . In the County Round:

U14 - was won by Trent who were eventually beaten by Millfield in the semi-finals

U16 – was again won by Trent who were knocked out in the quarter finals

U18 - won by Repton who then lost in the Midlands semi-finals.

The Derbyshire Round of National Mini – hockey championships went very well

U11 - Burton entered two teams and also teams from Belper, Buxton and St Anselms. This was won by Burton who were defeated in the Midlands round.

U13 - 3 teams from Belper, 2 from Burton, 2 from Trent and Barton and Buxton both entered a team.

This was won by a Belper team who went on to win the Midlands round and came fourth in the National Finals held on May 17th
